

CW+: The global state of the PMO: The UK perspective

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This research is based on the findings of a global, cross-sector study of more than 3,700 respondents on the state of project/programme management offices (PMO).

Results for UK PMOs:

Only 22% of non-PMO staff said the PMO properly assesses their training needs and provides relevant training.

Just over one-third (36%) of respondents said it is easier to plan their personal development and career growth as a result of the PMO's involvement.

UK PMOs' involvement and influence in the training of staff meet or exceed the global average.

UK PMOs offer more effective learning and development than the global average, but they have a long way to go in promoting the importance of project management across the organisation.

In the UK, PMOs tend to focus on three metrics for measuring PMO effectiveness: on-time, to-budget project delivery (74%); project success rates (67%); customer satisfaction (57%).
